AIR FILTER MODEL: AF760 OWNERS MANUAL



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GENERAL SAFETY RULES



WARNING: Do not attempt to operate the machine until you have read thoroughly and understood completely all instructions, rules, etc. contained in this manual. Failure to comply may result in accidents involving fire, electric shock, or serious personal injury. Keep this owner's manual and review frequently for continuous safe operation.

- 1. Know your machine. For your own safety, read the owner's manual carefully. Learn its application and limitations, as well as specific potential hazards pertinent to this machine.
- 2. Make sure all tools are properly earthed.
- 3. Keep guards in place and in working order. If a guard must be removed for maintenance or cleaning, make sure it is properly replaced before using the machine again.
- 4. Remove adjusting keys and spanners. Form a habit of checking to see that the keys and adjusting spanners are removed from the machine before switched it on.
- 5. Keep your work area clean. Cluttered areas and workbenches increase the chance of an accident.
- 6. Do not use in dangerous environments. Do not use power tools in damp or wet locations, or expose them to rain. Keep work areas well illuminated.
- 7. Keep children away. All visitors should be kept a safe distance
- 8. from the work area.
- 9. Make workshop childproof. Use padlocks, master switches and remove starter keys.
- 10. Do not force the machine. It will do the job better and be safer at the rate for which it is designed.
- 11. Use the right tools. Do not force the machine or attachments to do a job for which they are not designed. Contact the manufacturer or distributor if there is any question about the machine's suitability for a particular task.
- 12. Wear proper apparel. Avoid loose clothing, gloves, ties, rings, bracelets, and jewellery which could get caught in moving parts. Non-slip footwear is recommended. Wear protective hair covering to contain long hair.
- 13. Always use safety glasses. Normal spectacles only have impact resistant lenses. They are not safety glasses.
- 14. Do not over-reach. Keep proper footing and balance at all times.
- 15. Maintain the machine in good condition. Keep the machine clean for best and safest performance. Follow instructions for lubrication and changing accessories.
- 16. Disconnect the machine from power source before servicing and when changing the blade.
- 17. Never leave the machine running unattended. Turn the power off. Do not leave the machine until it comes to a complete stop.
- 18. Do not use any power tools while under the effects of drugs, alcohol or medication.
- 19. Always wear a face or dust mask if operation creates a lot of dust and/or chips. Always operate the tool in a well ventilated area and provide for proper dust removal. Use a suitable dust extractor.

Rating Description

Hobby: Suitable for Weekend DIY'ers and woodworking enthusiasts.

Generally lighter weight machines with lower power ratings and smaller tooling capacities. Typically only ever used by one person for short periods of time or longer periods of time infrequently. Machinery should be well maintained in a clean, dry environment such as a home workshop, garage or timber shed. **Expected maximum use of 100 hours annually**.

Please Note: Using a product in excess of its rating will void the manufacturer's free warranty.

Unpacking

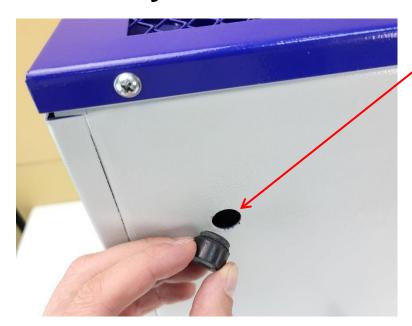


All items are contained in one carton.



Carefully unpack and check that all the items are present.

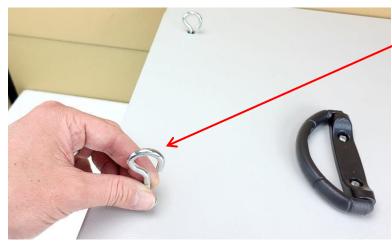
Assembly



Turn the Air Filter onto its side

Press the 4 rubber feet into the holes in the base of the Air Filter.

Tip: Use a small flat screwdriver to help press the flange through the hole.



Place the air filter onto a flat surface and screw 4 hanging hooks into the threaded holes.

Positioning The Filter



The Air Filter can either be ceiling mounted or bench mounted.

Ceiling mounted: Use the hanging chains and hooks provided to suspend it from the ceiling or exposed rafters.

Ideally the Air Filter wants to be mounted in the middle of the workshop or above the machinery that is producing the most dust.



Bench mounted: Sat on a work bench or on a shelf.

If positioned on a bench or shelf there must be a minimum gap of 300mm behind the Air Filter to allow the clean air to flow out of the filter.

Using Manual Control



Plug the power cord in.

Press the green ON/SPEED button once for Low, twice for Medium and three times for High speed.

Note: The LED light on the control panel will show what speed the unit is currently running at.

When finished using the air filter press the red off button.

Using the Remote Control



Speed Function

Press the ON/SPEED button once for Low speed, twice for Medium speed and three times for High speed.

Press the Off button to turn the Air Filter off.

Timer Function

The timer function allows the Air Filter to run on after you have finished working to clear the airborne dust for a period of 1, 2 or 4 hours.

To use this function, press the TIMER button on the remote handset. Once for 1 hour, twice for 2 hours or three times for 4 hours.

Note: The LED light on the control panel will show you what time period you have selected.

Active Flow Sensor



The Active Flow Sensor detects when the air flow falls below the operating threshold due to the filters becoming blocked.

When the filter is blocked an alarm will sound and the top row of lights on the control panel will start flashing.

Once the filters are cleaned or replaced: reset the system by holding in the ON/SPEED button for around 10 seconds, then release.

Removing the Filters



Periodically the filters will need removing for cleaning and eventually they will need replacing.

Remove the side plate by undoing the two screws on the top of the Air Filter.



The outer filter will now slide out of the opening.



Once the outer filter is removed the inner filter can slide forward and out of the opening.

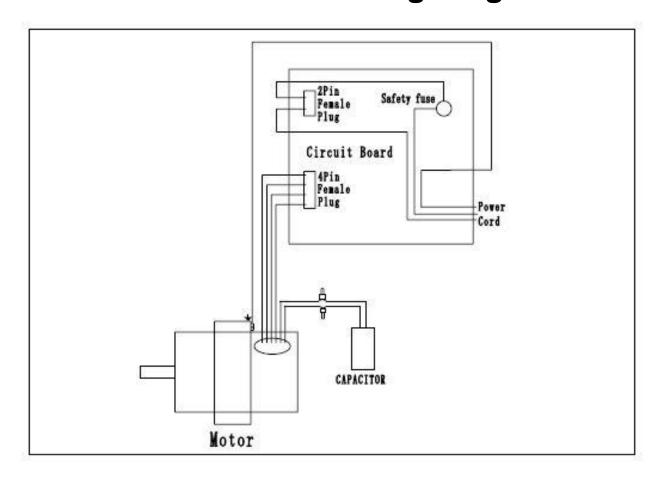

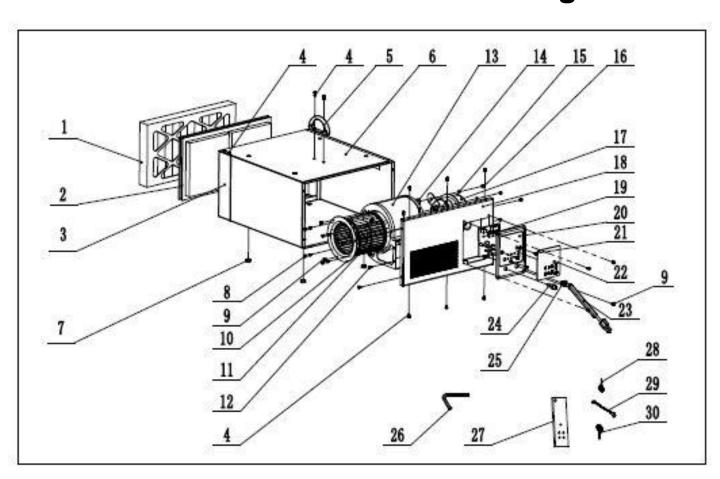
